Now, the server is easy to install (if you're running Linux) but to get a dynamic, push-based client that does a good job of communicating to other

clients is a real pain. Really, what I'd like to see is a dynamic client that could run on every machine with no config required. Maybe someday. Yeah, that sounds like a pretty big hurdle. I personally use Google's talk phone app which works really well, and you could even run your own XMPP server if you wanted.
