

Volkswagen Key Broken? What To Do Next!

So even if you can break an item of an electric key, it is entirely futile to remove stuck pieces or attempt to glue it back together, as it will eventually ruin the lock or ignition of your vehicle. • Call in a Professional Locksmith

Calling a locksmith who has a lot of experience in dealing with this issue is probably one of the most straightforward solutions. Instead, look for a locksmith who specializes in car keys, especially Volkswagen key replacement. As they might remove the section stuck in your lock or ignition and duplicate another key for you, this is the less timeconsuming and costly option compared to a dealership.

• You may go to an authorized dealer of Volkswagens.

Besides, really, if you prefer, you can visit an authorized Volkswagen dealer, and they will supply you with a new key for your Volkswagen. That option will take a bit more time than a locksmith and will cost a bit more. When you go there, do carry the car's VIN (Vehicle Identification Number) and proof of ownership with you, as these are needed for making a new key.

• Prevent Future Problems

After the issue has been solved, it should also be prevented from happening again. It should be cared for; it should not be twisted too much when being used in ignition or lock. If the key becomes too much used, then it should be replaced before it breaks.
