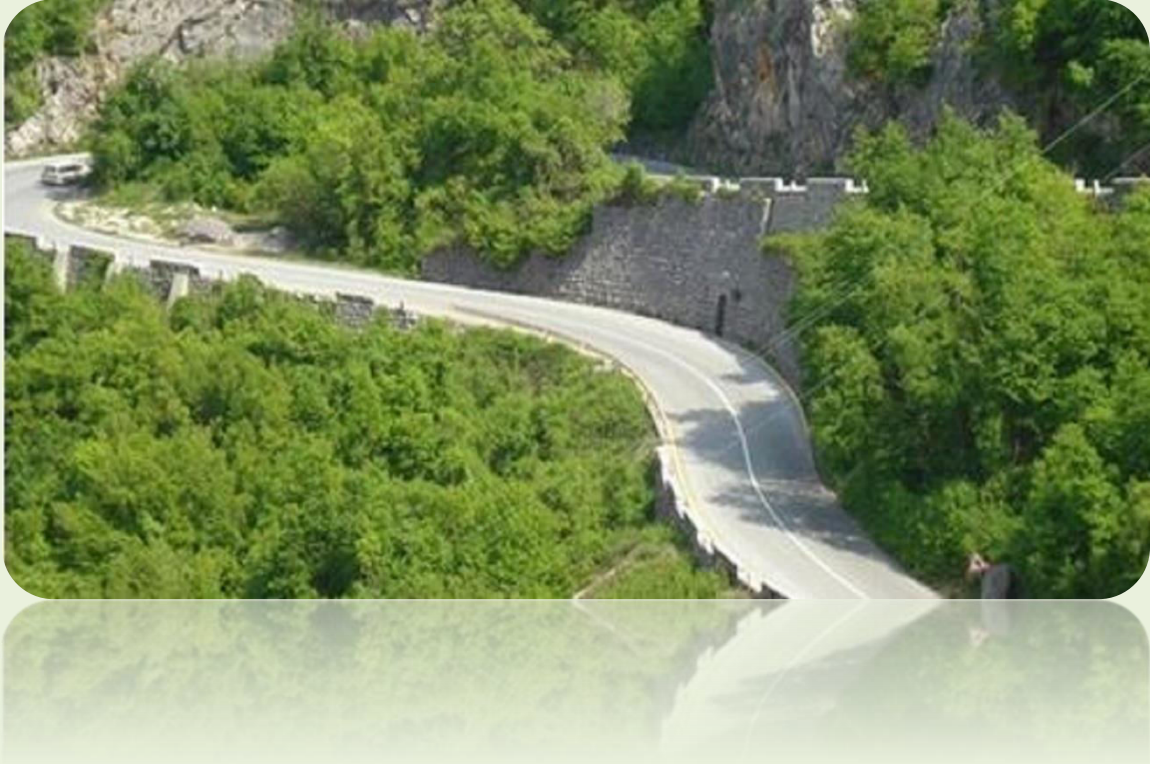




Packing Smart: What You Really Need for a 3-Week Motorcycle Adventure?

- **Tools and Maintenance**

The most basic tool kit should include wrenches, tire repair, chain oil, and a multi-tool. If only your bike could never break down, how nice would that be? For now, you must at least be prepared. Carry a small tire pump or Co2 inflator. Lubing the chain and checking the tires every day keeps you out of trouble on the road. Remember, you are your own mechanic out there.

- **Food, Water, Camping Equipment**

Hotels and restaurants will not always be there for you. Water bottles, some dry snacks, and maybe a lightweight stove are some of the things to keep in mind if you camp. A small tent, sleeping bag, and camping mat will do perfectly well. A minimalist camping kit puts an extra feather in the freedom cap of your route. You can just as well stop somewhere, set up camp, and spend the night. This accommodation also means saving some bucks and precious hours.
