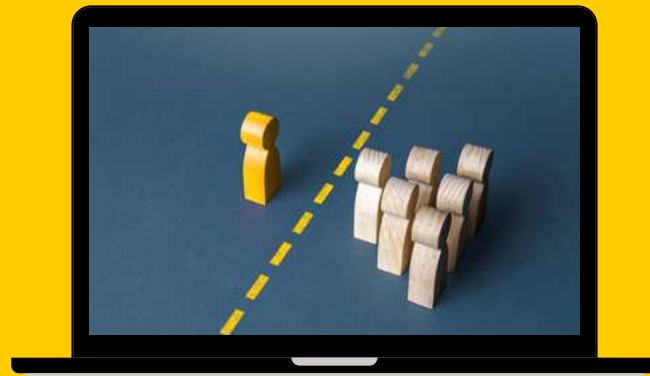


INTRODUCTION
