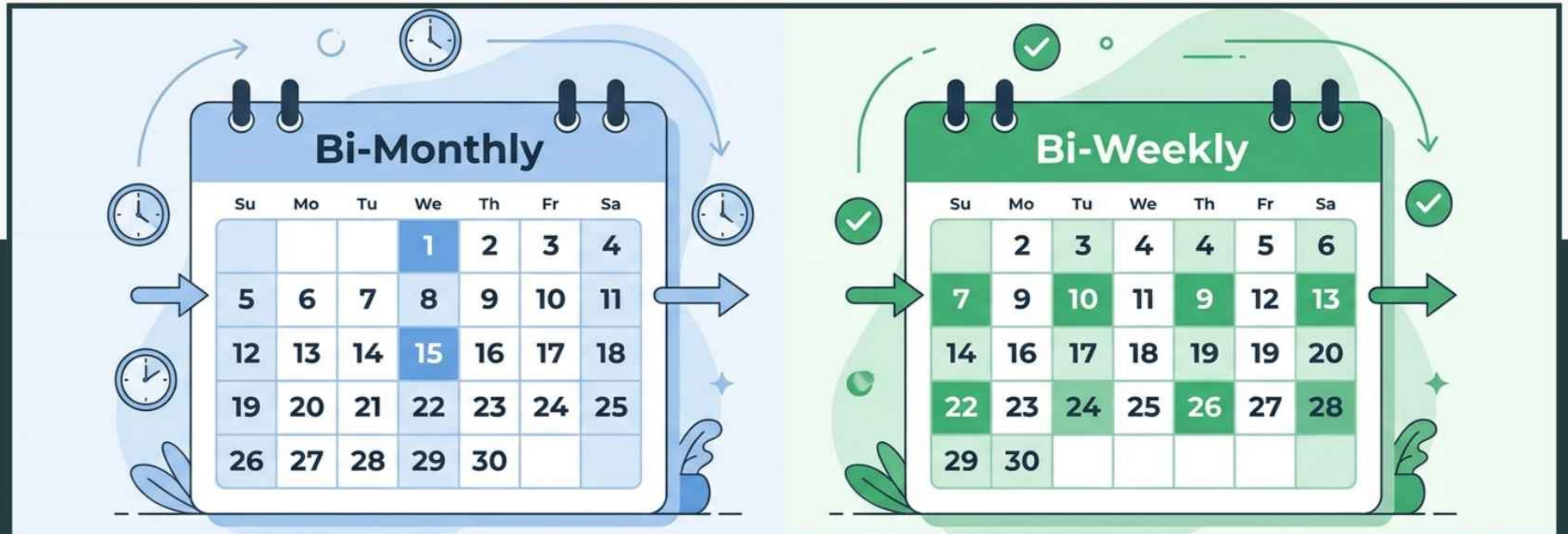


# BI-MONTHLY VS BI-WEEKLY:
