

Discover HR 98 Which City? Check the RTO Code and Location

Vehicle registration numbers in India provide useful information about the state and registering authority associated with a vehicle. Understanding these codes can help vehicle owners identify where a vehicle is registered and which Regional Transport Office (RTO) handles its records. - Registration Certificate (RC)
- Valid motor insurance
- Address or identity proof
- Purchase invoice
- Application forms

- Documents required for ownership transfer, when applicable

Therefore, vehicle owners planning a permanent move should check the applicable requirements instead of assuming that the original HR 98 registration automatically covers all interstate requirements.

Things to Check Before Buying a Used HR 98 Vehicle

The HR 98 code can tell you about the vehicle's registration region, but it should not be the only factor considered before purchasing a used vehicle.

A buyer should carefully verify:

1. Original Registration Certificate.
2. Chassis and engine numbers.
3. Current insurance policy.
4. Ownership and transfer history.
5. Applicable road tax records.
6. PUC certificate, where required.
7. Outstanding loan or hypothecation details.
8. Vehicle condition and service history.
9. Any applicable challan or legal records.
10. Documents required for transfer.

These checks can help establish whether the vehicle documentation is consistent and whether the transfer can be completed properly.

Difference Between an RTO Code and a Vehicle's Current Location

One common misunderstanding is that the registration code always shows where the vehicle is currently located. This is not necessarily true.

An RTO code identifies the registration authority associated with the vehicle. After registration, the vehicle may be driven to another city or state, sold to a new owner or relocated for work or other reasons.

For example, an HR 98 vehicle may currently be operating outside the Nuh region. The registration number can still retain its original HR 98 identification unless the applicable registration process changes it.

This distinction is especially useful when checking second-hand vehicles.

Importance of Keeping Vehicle Records Updated

Vehicle owners should keep registration, insurance and other vehicle documents accurate and current. Changes such as ownership transfer, address updates or interstate relocation may require communication with the relevant authority.

Keeping records updated can make routine services easier and reduce documentation-related problems.
